TRANSGENDERED PERSONS INCLUDE

crossdressers, pre-op and non-op transsexuals and postop transsexuals of male-to-female or female-to-male of any sexual orientation, and of all races, creeds, religions, ethnic backgrounds, nationalities, ages and degrees of physical impediment.

KNOWLEDGE OF LAW AND EMPLOYMENT POLICY FOR TRANSGENDERED PERSONS IS IMPORTANT BECAUSE DISADVANTAGE IN THE LAW AND LOSS OF EMPLOYMENT ARE THE BIGGEST PROBLEMS FACED BY THE TRANSGENDERED.

This is a very unforgiving society for those persons (and their loved ones) who were reared as one gender identity (socially defined by external genitalia), yet who have a definitely opposite but true gender identity.

This true gender identity must express itself: it does somewhere in a continuum ranging from crossdressing (in varying degrees) through full-time pre-op or non-op transsexualism to post-operative transsexualism.

The continuum is observed over a vastness and diversity in geography, race, education, religion, income, and career. Surely, to be so observed is evidence that to be transgendered is not a matter of mere choice.

Furthermore, rational people do not take upon themselves such unrelenting social pressure merely for a fling!

MINIMUM CONTINUING LEGAL EDUCATION (MCLE)
