Visit Your Local Library

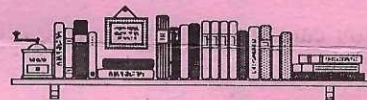

a better way

**Clip, clip,
hooray!**

Earrings are jewelry for the face and are essential to achieve a finished "fashion look".

Unfortunately, for those of us who have not taken the bold step into pierced ears, the selection of clip earrings is far less than of post earrings. Faced with slim choices, I decided to modify posts into clips. It's easy to do and opens up great new possibilities for your jewelry box collection. I should mention that this procedure is for disc or button type earrings only. I will address drop or dangle earring modification in a future article.

After finding your special earrings, locate a store that sells craft supplies. Sometimes art supply stores sell jewelry making supplies. Such stores sell earring back clips in gold or silver finishes. They are sold in poly bags on a peg rack, usually 3 pairs to a package @ \$1.25/pkg.

Then go to a hardware store and buy a tube of silicone cement mostly made by Dow Corning. It's about \$2 a tube which will do a lifetime of earring conversions.

With a pair of wire cutters, simply cut off the posts as close to the earring surface as possible. Apply a small dollop of adhesive, align the clip back making sure the earring will be worn in the correct orientation, press it into the adhesive and allow it to dry overnight. The earring must be in a flat position while it's drying to prevent the back from slipping out of place.

Most earring backs are perforated which allows the adhesive to engulf the earring surface backing which makes a slight soft cushion for your ear lobe. Great for all day wearing.

If you cannot find a local store for the earring backs, try writing to western Trimming Corp. in Chatsworth, CA 91311. They should be able to give you the name of a local dealer.

As a last resort, drop me a note and I'll try to help you locate or obtain a supply of earring backs. Write to: Kaye Fisher, P.O. Box 433, Corte Madera, CA 94925. It'll be nice earring from you!

P.S. Save the post backings for your wife or girlfriend. They sometimes lose them and spares are nice to have on hand.
