
Welcome to Cotillion 2006!

It was Rachael who first extended the invitation to me to ride on the TGSF Pride Float in 2002, an event which literally changed my life and gave me the courage and






Twelve years ago, Donna Sachet started her adventure in San Francisco and the City has applauded her fun-loving spirit, quick wit, and musical talent ever since. She reigned as Miss Gay SF in 1993 and as the thirtieth elected Empress of SF in 1995-96. As a live singer and tireless fundraiser, Donna has received many awards, including the 1995 Darrell Yee Award from the AIDS Emergency Fund, 1996 Cable Car Entertainer of the Year, 1997 International Jose Honors Imperial Award, 1998 InterClub Fund's Most Supportive Non-Leather Title-Holder, the Castro Lion Club 2000 President's Appreciation Award, the 2000 Alice B. Toklas Lesbian & Gay Democratic Club Community Service Award, designation as the Leather Empress by the Leather Community in 2002, and Sainthood from the Sisters of Perpetual Indulgence in 2004.



Accolades have come her way from 3 San Francisco mayors, the City Board of Supervisors, the State Legislature, and the esteemed Herb Caen. She has served on the Board of Directors of the AIDS Emergency Fund, Positive Resource Center, the Imperial Council, and the SF LGBT Community Center and is currently on the State Board of Equality California. She is most proud of her annual Songs of the Season musical variety show benefiting the AIDS Emergency Fund for the past 12 years. Donna has served as national spokesmodel for Smirnoff Twist Vodka, co-anchored the live television coverage of the June SF Pride Parade for the last 3 years, appeared on Bay Area Backroads this year, served as the spokesmodel for Halloween in the Castro for the last 3 years, and can be heard singing on the benefit holiday compilation Carols Across America. Donna Sachet was selected as a Community Grand Marshal for the 2005 SF Pride Parade. She currently writes a biweekly column for the Bay Area Reporter and co-hosts a monthly LGBT television series called OUTSpoken on Comcast. Travelsthroughtime—ahistoryofTransgenderSanFrancisco

We began in the early 1980's as an organization called ETVC. That stood for Educational TV Channel, a rather obscure and elusive way to handle addressing and contacts. We are indebted to those individuals with the courage to step forward to help end the isolation that most transgendered people were experiencing. To this end, they decided that all major events and functions would be held in public venues, a radical idea for the time.

Success was immediate and growth came rapidly. By 1994, ETVC was recognized as a 501c(3) nonprofit organization under both federal and state laws. ETVC was also a major proponent of the transgender civil rights ordinance enacted in late 1994 by the San Francisco Board of Supervisors.

By 1998, ETVC began to assert ourselves in the world and find pride in who we were. Consequently, such obscurity became unnecessary and our name was changed to TGSF, for Trans Gender San Francisco. Our primary purpose is education, outreach and support for the transgender community. Although we have "San Francisco" in our name, our members hail from all over the Bay Area, the Central Valley, northern California and across the country and world. As an example of our reach, our contestants for Mr. and Ms. TGSF live in several different counties.

Our major outreach effort is the TGSF Channel, a 24 page publication which is published monthly. The Channel includes upcoming events and news of interest to the community, within the Bay area and from across the country. We are an all-volunteer organization with members from all over the world. We are very pleased and honored by the support we have received from the business community, many of whom have advertised in this program.

Let it be known that anyone with any kind of gender identify issue is welcome at TGSF. It does not matter where you are on the gender spectrum, your race, age, color or sexual orientation. If you feel that we can help you, you are welcome to walk through our doors. We guarantee that you will be greeted with a hug and a smile.

TGSF will always remain dedicated to helping all of whom who wish to "walk with pride into the light".

And when our dear friends Roxy (Madam President, TGSF), Carla (Mom-in-law) and other members of the Ex-Com asked me to please participate this year as Mr. TGSF, well here I am, at your service. There is no contestant here that will ever be a loser, we are all winners. Blessings to you all.

Contestant #1 - Lisa

Hi, I'm Lisa Dummer and I'm running for Ms. TGSF again this year. Why would I subject myself to all of the time constraints and effort again? Mainly, though, the answer is because I'm angry – angry that it took 55 years for me to admit who I was and act on it; angry that it was an act of desperation, not choice, that forced me to acknowledge my true self; angry that there are thousands of us who aren't even able to step outside their front door out of fear. I am running



for Ms. TGSF to teach people that transgender men and women are important and productive members of society so that the men and women who come after me will not have to deal with the fear, anxiety and depression that being a transgender person causes – that to be themselves can be a matter of choice, not desperation; an act of choice to be a part of the community that has embraced me.
